Did you know that ...

- Chesapeake Skipjacks are the last working boats under sail in the United States
- They were designed in the Chesapeake region around 1890 to dredge oysters
- "Skipjack" refers to fish like Skipjack Herring and Skipjack Mackerel that are known for leaping out of the water
- Skipjacks are the Official Boat of Maryland
- Ranging in size from 25 to 50 ft. they are known for power and speed in light winds
- By WWII there were over 2000 Skipjacks on the Chesapeake
- By 2003 there were only a dozen Skipjacks left
- Many were built on Tilghman Island and the oldest, Rebecca T Ruark built in 1886, is in Dogwood Harbor and is a National Historic Landmark
- There are working 4 Skipjacks in Dogwood Harbor on Tilghman Island
- In the Tilghman Watermen's Museum you will find many models, photos and paintings of Skipjacks

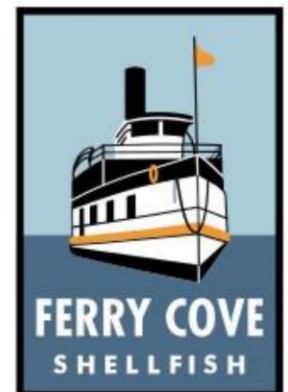
On Saturday, January 21st at 4:30 PM the Tilghman Watermen's Museum will host Steven Weschler from the Ferry Cove Oyster Hatchery in Sherwood as the first speaker for the 2023 TWM Speaker Series.

Maryland's portion of the Chesapeake Bay was once the epicenter for oyster production in the United States but overtime, due to several factors, the industry has seen a dramatic decline in harvests from over 10 million of bushels annually to a few hundred thousand.

Through its hatchery and production facilities at Ferry Cove, the goal of Ferry Cove Shellfish is to facilitate the growth and long-term viability of the commercial shellfish industry. Using advanced hatchery production techniques including a recirculating aquaculture system (RAS) and biosecurity systems, coupled with its green building design and energy-efficient upgrades, Ferry Cove Shellfish will provide the industry with high-quality, low-cost larvae and seed.
